## Ten Desselaer

SEN-school (school for special educational needs):

- Children with difficulties in social interaction
- Externalizing versus internalizing behaviour
- Individual approach: small class groups (average of 8 students), adaptation to the children's specific needs
- Individual plan for each child.
- Selection of targets ( type 1-8-2, and the regular curriculum)
- Multidisciplined team: teachers, therapist (speach and motor skills), paramedical specialists
- The children need a specific certifcate to enroll in this school.


## Ten Desselaer

3 hours of sport weekly
1 hour "Club" (=activity of their choice) weekly
Extra-mural activities
Crisis intervention

Children with an ASD diagnosis

- Borderline or normal intelligence

Key aspects:

- Small class groups (8 students)
- Offering structure and clarity: separate play-time, lunch time, activities, ...
- Focus on social and communication skills
- Therapists for speech therapy and physiotherapy

## Department conduct and emotional problems

Children with severe conduct and/or emotional problems (conduct disorder diagnosis is not required)

- A normal intelligence or slight mental retardation Fundamental aspects of our approach:
- Offering a predictable and restricted context: separate play-time, lunch time, activities, ...
- Focus on the emotional and social development
- Attitude of acceptance


## Statistics regarding the department emotional and conduct problems

60 children between the age of 3 and 13
Boys-girls ratio: 50/10
Externalising problem behaviour

- Verbal and physical agression ( towards children, teachers, schoolequipment)
50\% are placed in an institution
- Problematic educational context: fysical or sexual abuse, emotional or physical neglect
- Parents that are placed in Psychiatric institutions or in jail
